This is a job for every day.



Write a story about a visit to the seaside





    
Look at the pictures on the next page for inspiration

A middle: to talk about the main events

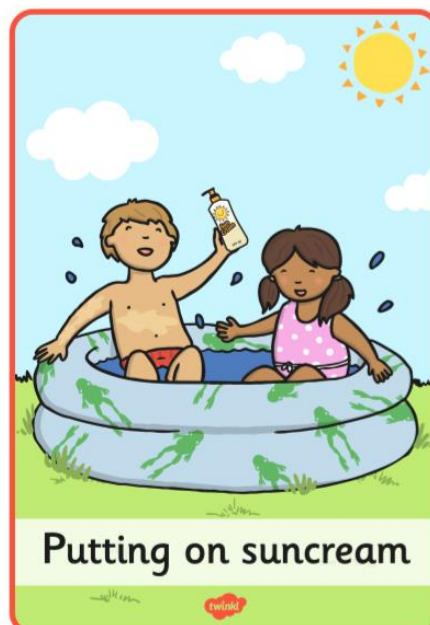
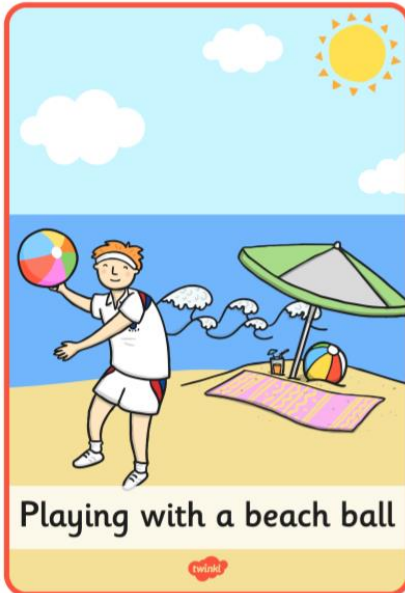
   
An end: to indicate your story has finished



 or  this weeks  focus  stories;  Alba the 100 year old fish and  Sharing a Shell
