Other FUN activities you could do:

Rainbow Wind Chimes

Outdoor Activity

You will need:

- Sticks of varying lengths.
- Craft varnish
- String
- Sanding block or sandpaper
- Acrylic paint in colours of the rainbow.
- Screw eyes



- 1** Go on a stick hunt and find 5 or 6 sticks of varying length,
- 2** Peel the bark off of the sticks.
- 3** Use sandpaper or a sanding block to make the sticks smooth.
- 4** Paint each stick a different colour of the rainbow.
- 5** To give the sticks that extra bit of protection, varnish them.
- 6** When all the sticks are dry, screw a tiny screw eye into the end of each stick.
- 7** Tie a piece of string to each stick and hang up where you choose in your outdoor area.

Outdoor Activity

You will need:

- Flour
- Sticks of equal length
- Any natural found items
- Sieve (optional)

The Activity

1. Use the sticks to make a square. This will be the frame for the artwork.
2. Ask the child to place their hand in the square and to keep it very still.
3. Sieve or scatter flour over and around the child's hand.
4. Carefully remove the child's hand and brush off the flour (away from the artwork). You should be left with an empty space where the child's hand was.
5. Allow the child to add any natural found items to their artwork, such as leaves and acorns.
6. You could ask some children to use their finger to write their initial or name in the flour.



Your Very Own Pet Rock!

You will need:

- Medium-sized rocks (one per child)
- Paint
- Small paintbrushes
- Googly eyes
- White glue
- Glue spreaders
- Marker pens (optional)
- Decorative items, such as wool, pom-poms, pipe cleaners (optional)



Instructions

1. Choose a rock and think about what sort of an animal it's going to be. You might want to plan your pet on paper before you start decorating your rock.
2. Paint your rock all over. You could choose one colour or add lots of different colours!
3. Once the paint is dry, put a small amount of glue on the back of two googly eyes. Stick the eyes on your rock and hold them for a few seconds. Wait for the glue to completely dry before completing the next step.
4. Now, it's time to get creative and start adding your details! Use a small paintbrush (or marker pens) to add more details, such as a mouth, teeth or nose. Marker pens are great for adding patterns!
5. Next, add any further decorations you want. You could add wool hair, pipe cleaner feet, wings or legs.
6. Leave the decorations to completely dry.
7. Enjoy showing off your very own pet rock!
