Place Value scavenger hunt

What you need to do:

- You are going to be a number detective. You need to find a number that fits the description. When you find a number that matches the description, cut it out and stick it in the box next to the description. Here is an example:



- I'd love to see any photos of what you find!

A zero in the ones/unit place

A three in the tens place
A five in the units/ones place
A one in the tens place
A seven in the units/ones place
A four in the tens place
A two in the tens place

Extension activity:
Make another grid but this time include numbers that might be in the hundreds place, so extending the activity by using three digit numbers
